

#### **Lent 2024**

Ash Wednesday marks the start of Lent for Christian churches throughout the world. It is a time for Christians to prepare for Easter through penance, prayer, reflection and repentance of their sins.

Lent always begins on Ash Wednesday and lasts for 40 days and 40 nights until Maundy Thursday 28 March, The last week of Lent is Holy Week, which starts with Palm Sunday and ends with Holy Saturday (Easter Eve). Easter Day is not part of Lent and is instead a period of celebration to commemorate our belief in the Resurrection of Jesus Christ.


#### Schola Cantorum




