#### **Ringfinnan Garden of Remembrance**

The Garden of Remembrance is dedicated to the memory of Fr. Michael Judge, Chaplain in the New York Fire Department and to the 343 brave fire fighters, who so courageously lost their lives in New York on 11 September 2001.

The Garden was initiated by Kathleen Murphy, a nurse in New York City. She was born in Ringfinnan, and had intended to build a home for herself on the site but thought a better use for the land was to build the Garden of Remembrance.

The Garden was officially dedicated in 2002 and this year over thirty firefighters from New York were joined by Irish firefighters as they cycled from the US Ambassador's Residence in Dublin to Kinsale in aid of Irish and US charities.
